

DUBAI RECLAIMS TOP POSITION AS WORLD'S BUSIEST INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Expo 2020 has the attention of the world right now, as it is one of the first major global events open to visitors and Dubai expects to boost its economy by attracting 25 million tourist visits.



DUBAI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT IS HOME TO EMIRATES AIRLINES

The world's biggest long-haul carrier, which has already restored 90 percent of its network and is on track to reach 70 percent of its pre-pandemic capacity by the end of 2021.

Dubai is on the right path to full recovery as the emirate's airports handled 13 million passengers in the first seven months of 2021 as Dubai International (DXB) reclaimed its position as the world's busiest airport.

The United Arab Emirates, which hosts the Expo 2020 and the T20 World Cup, is entering the height of its tourist season.

Dubai International overtook Amsterdam airport to take the top spot with over 2.72 million seats.

DUBAI RANKED FIFTH-BEST CITY IN THE WORLD

DXB clocked 10.6 million passengers in the first six months of 2021 despite travel restrictions affecting its key source markets throughout the second quarter. Dubai Airports has also projected robust growth for DXB in the second half of 2021.

You can ride the elevator to the top of the world's tallest building for a bird's-eye view, bet on the ponies at the world's richest horse race and pose for photos in front of the world's tallest choreographed fountains.



It also listed the attractions that are coming up in the city: The iconic Museum of the Future; the world's largest observation wheel, Ain Dubai; and a new John Wick roller coaster, part of the Motiongate Dubai theme park.
